

Is Time for a Garage Sale?

My family recently had our first garage sale in 13 years. In the months prior to the sale we had gone through every room in the house to find all those items we knew we would never use again, would not miss or just needed to clear out. A few things were broken, many were useful but had served their purpose and were no longer needed and some just did not fit who we are as a family.

We were determined to get rid of all the extras that just took up space or added clutter to our home life. We sold what we could and had a local charity come pick up what was left.

Having a garage sale is one of those events that a few people love to do but most are like us who say "never again" when it is over.

After it was all done, Mary Beth stated that the whole process was rather cathartic. To be able to let go of possessions, some once valuable to us, is freeing and reminded me of Jesus' many challenges to not be controlled by our possessions but to use them for God's glory.

It also helped me realize how important it is to have a regular "garage sale" of the heart. All of us need to examine our lives for those things that clutter our spirits and weigh us down with the cares of the world. We need to face our areas of brokenness and allow God's healing to work in us or be ready to let those things go. We need to be honest about those 2x4 planks that blind us and be ready to throw them in the junk pile.

David felt the same way in Psalm 139. As he marveled at God's amazing creation of the human body and God's embracing presence in our lives, he knew he needed God's help with his "garage sale." He said:

"Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting."

Has it been a while since your last "garage sale"? Are you ready for another one? God is ready to help each of us see beyond our own blindness and lead us into the joy and peace He has promised. This is the freedom that comes through Christ. So take the challenge and have a garage sale with God and know His love in a new way.

Angel Tree 2011

All too often the forgotten victims of crime are the little children of inmates who are left without a mother or father through no fault of their own. Statistics show that these children are "high risk" for ending up in prison themselves. Angel Tree ministry is a way you can help to break the cycle of crime by sharing the love of JESUS with children of inmates. HE says, "And whoever welcomes a little child like this in my name welcomes me." Matthew 18:5

This is how Angel Tree works. The parent, who is an inmate, submits

an application to Prison Fellowship asking for gifts to be delivered to his/her children at Christmas. The gifts are bought and wrapped by us and given to the children in the name of the absent parent and Jesus. Age-appropriate Gospel materials will be attached to each gift also. The most important thing we can do is to tell these children that Jesus loves them.

On Sunday, December 4th, twenty five little paper angels will adorn a tree in the Narthex. Please prayerfully consider choosing an ANGEL, which will contain all the

information you need to purchase 2 gifts (a toy and an article of clothing with a suggested total cost of \$40). One week later, December 11th, you will be asked to bring the gifts, wrapped separately, to church. A delivery team will be prepared to deliver the gifts but if you choose to do so, you can also deliver the gifts in time for Christmas. "I tell you the truth, whatever you did for the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me". Matthew 26:40



Your Pastor Nominating Committee continues to make progress towards the task of finding the pastor that God has already prepared for us.

In addition to making progress on the wording of our Church Information Form (CIF), we met with Session and with our Presbytery Liaison in September and October to finalize several key areas. As of the time of this writing (October 16th), we are close to our final wording. Once we have the CIF completed, it will be reviewed by Session and Presbytery and then published to the Church Leadership Connection (CLC) website.

Our goal is to complete the CIF and publish it sometime in November or sooner. We are also working with Session committees on our budgetary needs for 2012 activities.

Once the CIF is published, we will begin to receive and review Pastor Information Forms, or PIF's. Each member of the PNC appreciates your continued prayers.

An ad hoc committee was formed to study the summary of PCUSA's New Form of Government to determine if adjustments to our bylaws need to be made.

Presbytery is recognizing that their meetings tend to be 'just business' and will be changing the format of some meetings to allow for more spiritual and relational aspects. 'Presbyfest' will be the first of these meetings scheduled for Jan 28, 2012 held at Mercer Island.

As I write in my song If I Gave You Everything, "If I gave you everything It would never be enough but I'll give it anyway to thank you for Your love."
